Trash Collection Update

Turtle Creek's trash contract with Duncan (now Rizzo) ends June 30, 2017. Effective July 1, Turtle Creek will receive trash collection through the City of Novi's contract with Waste Management. Based on the city's collection map, our tentative pick-up day will be Friday and service will start July 7 (but will most likely be delayed until Saturday, July 8 due to the Fourth of July holiday).

Anticipated cost for one year (July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018) will be \$162.24 per residence, since we are joining the program in the second year of the five year contract. This fee will be split between summer and winter property tax bills.

There is a wealth of information regarding trash collection on the City of Novi web site (cityofnovi.org). From the homepage, select the *Community* link at the top, and then click on *Trash Collection Services*. We expect that residents will receive additional details directly from the city and/or Waste Management closer to our July start date.

In addition, please consider signing up for Turtle Creek electronic communications, so you'll receive pertinent information which may be sent to the Turtle Creek Homeowners Association.

Electronic Communications

Residents can receive newsletters and other essential information electronically by providing an email address. Currently, 55% of Turtle Creek households receive electronic communications. This saves the association mailing costs and provides residents with current information. *Email addresses are NOT included in the homeowners' directory*; they are used only for newsletters and occasional messages from the Turtle Creek board. Residents who haven't provided an email address will receive printed newsletters.

Neighborhood Reminders

- Spring and summer bring families outdoors. <u>Please</u> observe speed limits in the subdivision to keep our neighbors safe!
- Please leave your porch lights on at night for safety.
- Do not leave cars on the street overnight to avoid potential theft or damage.
- Recreational vehicles and trailers cannot be stored in your driveway unless you are packing/unpacking for a trip.
- Please keep pets on a leash while walking through the subdivision and clean up after them when needed.

Protect Your Family from Mosquitoes - Tips from Oakland County Health Department

The best way to prevent diseases spread by mosquitoes is to avoid being bitten. The following can help protect you and your family from mosquito bites:

- Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellant. All EPA-registered insect repellants are evaluated for safety and effectiveness.
- Always follow the product label instructions carefully, especially when applying insect repellant on children.
- Do not use insect repellant on babies younger than 2 months of age.
- Do not apply insect repellant on a child's hands, eyes, mouth, or on cut or irritated skin.
- Adults: Spray insect repellant on your hands and then apply to a child's face.
- Wear protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- Avoid areas where mosquitoes may be present, including indoor areas.
- Avoid outdoor activities during daylight for about two hours after sunrise and several hours before sunset. Protect yourself from mosquito bites at night.
- Maintain window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of buildings. Do not prop open doors.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by removing standing water in and around your home. Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, roof gutters, or trash containers.
- Look for non-toxic mosquito control options to rid your yard of mosquitoes without harming beneficial insects.

Mosquito-borne diseases are those spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. Some diseases that are spread by mosquitoes include Zika virus, West Nile virus, St. Louis Encephalitis (SLE), Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE), and LaCrosse (LAC) virus.
